### 1. Purpose

The purpose of this statement is to outline our approach to ensuring that D&H Steel Construction minimises the risk of modern slavery in our business operations and supply chain. #### 2. Our Business

The company began in 1972 and rapidly grew to become one of the leading structural steel fabricators in the Auckland region providing structural steel for a wide variety of projects including warehousing, industrial plants and highrise buildings.

Since 2008 D&H Steel has expanded nationwide to become one of the country's largest steel construction company's and the leader of innovation in the steel industry with the early adoption of new technologies, techniques and systems.

Today we have a turnover of \$100M+ and some 250 employees.
